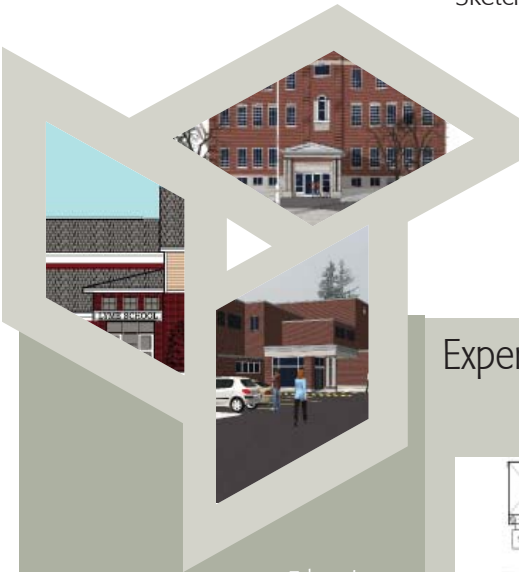




Charlie Veysey

Stevens High School Claremont, New Hampshire
