## Jones Ferry River Access Boathouse (Holyoke, MA)

This riverfront community building included meeting and changing rooms and featured high performance envelope including a green roof. Noteworthy environmental aspects included a super-insulated building envelope, efficient heating and energy recovery systems, solar hot water heating and vegetated roofs on low slope segments.
