Auburn Town Hall

(Auburn, NH) Banwell Architects assisted Stantec Consulting Services with a study of this existing historic town hall, followed by programming, design and construction of substantial renovations for improved office function, security, accessibility and energy efficiency. Phase One interior renovations were completed December 2010, exterior work for new entry addition awaits funding.

Barre City Place
