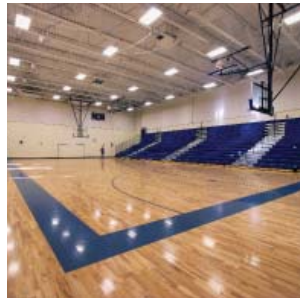




Jules Chatot, AIA, LAP

Champlain Valley Union High School (Hinesburg, VT)

Crossett Brook is a Union Middle School sited in a pastoral setting that is the former site of the Vermont State Farm building. The Crossett Brook Middle School accommodates both Waterbury and Duxbury areas and was planned in coordination with a masterplan for the Town of Waterbury to develop a new town center.
